Our hope is that the living, breathing words of truth that are revealed to you become a part of your everyday life. In the book of James, we read about a key to living life with God. We are told that if we ask for wisdom by faith then we shall receive it generously from our Father in Heaven. One of the best ways to receive this wisdom is by preparing to receive it. Message Theme

Living to Give.

Key Concepts/Truths

Jesus did not accomplish everything so that we could do nothing. He did everything to pay for our salvation and our work is to spread the word of what He has done and live in the new life that is available to us.

Many times we are focused more on our own tangible life and personal comfort, but Jesus calls us to be focused primarily on His eternal Kingdom.

When we let anything other than the Kingdom of God become our focus it has the potential to choke out the word of God in our lives.

Everything we have is a gift from God and should be used to bring him glory.

Our gifts and talents given by God are meant for us to be able to support one another. "Love God, love people" should be the mission statement of every believer.

What we believe is important, foundational, and necessary. Our actions are tied to what we believe.

God has prepared good works for us to do while we are on earth in order to bless others. As we bless others, we too are blessed.

Real-Life Application

The impact that our giving has on both our own lives and the Kingdom of God is astounding. When we bless others by giving of our time, finances, and talents, we genuinely add to the Kingdom, bringing more of it here on Earth. We find ourselves blessed as we bless others, and it becomes easier and more enjoyable to give.

We can overlook people and problems so easily due to issues of our own. Ask yourself, "When is the last time that I checked in on someone to see what needs they have in their life?"

Many times we can make a purposeful decision to give, but without something specific in front of us to give to we can lose track of that mission. Ask God to put something or someone on your mind and in your heart. Ask how you can be a blessing to them this week and watch God build his Kingdom through your obedience.

Partnering with God is always a blessing to everyone involved.

This Week's Declarations

Life is released when your words are in agreement with God. Intentionally speaking life and biblical truth out loud is extremely powerful. In fact, you have that very life in the power of your tongue. These words below, when spoken out loud, will cause an acceleration of the reality of God's words in your life. We encourage you to speak the following with an expectancy to renew your mind and see God's fullness.

- I choose to use my gifts, talents, and finances for the Kingdom of God.
- I choose to use my gifts, talents, and finances to bless others.

• As I give of what God has given me, I know that I will receive a reward from my Heavenly Father.

• Father help me to have a heart that desires to DO ALL THE GOOD that I CAN. BY ALL THE MEANS that I CAN. IN ALL THE WAYS that I CAN, and ALL THE PLACES I CAN. AT ALL THE TIMES I CAN. TO ALL THE PEOPLE I CAN. AS LONG AS I EVER CAN.
