Message Theme & Prayer Focus

Just Say No to Greed

"Father, prepare my heart to receive what you have for me in this message. Thank you for your love, your truth, and your desire to see me grow, thrive, and become more of the person you created me to be. Thank you for blessing me to be a blessing. It's by your strength that I will continue in that, all the days of my life to glorify you, in Jesus' name. Amen!"

Key Concepts/Truths

Jesus taught us to pray that the Kingdom of Heaven would come now, and not for us to focus on going somewhere else, some other time. The Kingdom is here now, and Jesus wants it to affect our lives and change the world today.

We believe the Word of God is the most powerful thing, but we can't misunderstand that the deceitfulness of riches, or greed, will choke the Word out of our lives, making it ineffective.

Greed lies to us by saying that if we just had more that we would be more valuable, have more purpose, and greater ability. But our net worth and our self worth are not the same, and our life is more than the abundance of things that we have.

Money does not give purpose, security, peace, or happiness. Money is a wonderful servant, but a terrible master, because it is never satisfying. When God blesses us, He wants us to enjoy that blessing, but we'll never find our identity in temporary things that we receive. We should be ready to give generously out of what has been given to us and be willing to share.

Money itself is not inherently evil. It's a magnifier, and allows us to do more of whatever we are already doing and multiply what is already in our heart. With money comes the responsibility to be accountable to the Lord with how we use what we have been given to build His Kingdom.

God blesses us financially to be able to give. The real purpose of money is for us to give and meet needs. Tithing (the first 10%) is a vital part of that blessing lifestyle.

God put into our very being everything we would need in order to do every great thing He has already planned for us. He created us in such a way that we would be more fulfilled by doing what He created us for than by anything the world has to offer us.

When we take something that is temporary and put it into the Kingdom of God it instantly becomes eternal. It will be worth every penny when we do.

Daily Application

Money is a magnifier. It enlarges what already exists in our heart. If there is a love for others and the desire to bless them in our heart, then when we come into blessing we'll be ready to do what God intended for us to do--give. But we can't wait and think "once I am blessed, then I will be a blessing to others". We need to start where we are with what we have. We've all been given something from our good Father who gives good gifts. Whether it be finances, talent, time, or anything else, all that is required to be a giver is to have a right heart posture.

As we allow the Lord to prepare us and set our heart right in our current situation, we'll be ready to be a blessing to others with the things that God has blessed us with. One practice we can actively engage in to develop a right heart is to give thanks to God regularly for what we have. When we recognize Him as the source of everything we are and everything that we have, we'll begin to steward those things in a greater way because we realize that they're not our own. The Lord gives, so that we can also give. He's modeling a way for us to follow, and since there is a way that the Lord deems right, then let us fully follow that way and experience life as He intended.

"I look not to temporary things for security, happiness, and provision, but to God and His ability to meet all my needs. I do not look to the abundance of things to find my identity or self worth, but to God and who He created me to be. I follow and trust God and His plan for my life. I allow Him to mold and mature me into someone that loves to bless others so that, when I am blessed, I can share out of what has been given to me and build the Kingdom, in Jesus' name!"
