Walking with God (Living by Faith pt 1)
A Sermon Application Guide

This guide is designed to offer a simple tool for those wanting to take the next step with Sunday's message. You can print this guide to study on your own, or use it in a group and experience transformation together.

Message Theme & Prayer Focus

Prayer Part 1 - A Relationship With God

"Father God, you are holy, worthy, and praise be to your name. I pray for your kingdom, your will, and your way to be done. Thank you for letting me partner with you in building your kingdom on this Earth. God, supply me with what I need for today, and forgive me when I get swept up, distracted, and tempted by things of this world. I thank you and I love you. Amen."

Key Concepts/Truths

In Genesis we get a beautiful picture of how normal it can be to walk with Christ. Sometimes we can think that walking with Christ means being weird or eccentric, but Genesis says that Enoch walked with God while going about his normal human life every day.

As believers, we are the bride of Christ and it's our gift to walk with God. Just as we have an ongoing relationship with a family member or spouse, we are to engage in our relationship with Christ. We need to stay in communication with Him and constantly pursue Him as He does with us.

Prayer, in its simplest form, is communication with God. It's key to staying connected to, and knowing, our Father. Prayer is so much more than a one-sided conversation asking requests of God.

Along with connection to our Father, another goal in our prayers is to pray with intentionality. The result of our prayer should be the building of the kingdom. Choosing to go after the things of God in prayer is so important, but it's just as important to wait for God to respond.

We are given a great Kingdom-focused model of prayer from Jesus in Matthew 6:9:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.
Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
And forgive us our debts as we also have forgiven our debtors;
And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

When we understand the power of prayer, it will be a natural desire of ours to do so with our Father as often as we can. Our focus will be pulled off of ourselves in prayer and turned to thanksgiving to our Creator. Imagine the joy that the Father gets when we turn to him with excitement and thankfulness for what He has blessed us with.

Daily Application

A huge part of prayer is turning the focus away from selfish ambition and placing our attention where it belongs, on God and His kingdom. Changing our prayer mindset from routine and chore to the privilege of being able to honor the Creator will cause us to see things from His perspective. It's from that view that we can truly see the circumstances we are in, for what they really are, and do what needs to be done. The book of Philippians tells us not to worry about anything, but to pray about everything with thanksgiving.

This week, rather than praying from a place of requests, take time to thank God for the things He has provided for you, how He has shown up in time of need, and the ways He has remained faithful to you. Challenge yourself to do so with a posture of thankfulness. Get out of your comfort zone. This could look like raising your hands, singing your thanks, writing it all down to read throughout the day, going on a walk and saying out loud all He has done and is doing in the world today. God is so good and we can never thank Him enough.

This Week's Declaration

"I declare today that God is in control. I remind myself that He is worth my time, He is worth my attention, and He is worth my prayer and praise. Father, I turn my attention to you and I thank you for remaining so faithful. I recognize that you desire connection with me and I desire that as well. Today and this week I invite you into my family, work, and decisions. Lead me in the way that I should go to build your kingdom, in Jesus' name!"

What's Next?

Now it's time to write down anything that the Lord has spoken to you. Praise Him, Thank Him and ask the Holy Spirit to help you walk this out.

For perhaps he departed for a while for this *purpose*, that you might receive him forever, no longer as a slave but more than a slave—a beloved brother, especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord. If then you count me as a partner, receive him as *you would* me. But if he has wronged you or owes anything, put that on my account. I, Paul, am writing with my own hand. I will repay—not to mention to you that you owe me even your own self besides. Yes, brother, let me have joy from you in the Lord; refresh my heart in the Lord. Having confidence in your obedience, I write to you, knowing that you will do even more than I say.
