Title: Battlegrounds of Forgiveness

Message Theme & Prayer Focus

Betrayal & Forgiveness

"Father God, continue the work in my heart that you've started. You have so freely forgiven me, teach me to forgive the people in my life I may be holding bitterness toward. Thank you that I can bring my brokenness and sin to you, and thank you for your never ending grace. I rest in the privilege of your forgiveness. Amen."

Key Truths & Applications

In John 12, we can learn a great deal from Judas' bitterness toward Jesus, seeing the importance of not making rash decisions while we are bitter.

In 1 Samuel 18, King David lets an offense into his heart and the next day an evil spirit shows up.

What this means for us: Hanging onto bitterness opens the door for the devil to come into our lives, leading us to places that we don't want to be. The offense in our heart grows and ends up getting in the way of what the Lord wants for us. Many times, the offense runs free inside of us as a result of an unresolved conflict. We should be vigilant to do as Matthew 5 says, holding forgiving others, and resolving any anger, in the highest of priority.

Jesus told His disciples how often they were supposed to forgive–always. Most people believe that forgiveness is done by feelings, when we actually forgive by faith. By faith, we speak the decision to forgive and release someone from the offense they caused.

In the story of Esther, Haman boasted of all he had and all he desired, but he was still holding bitterness in his heart toward the Jews, souring every other area of his life.

What this means for us: Bitter people do not enjoy life. They miss out on all the things around them because they are focused on this bitterness that is tying them down. Anger is inside their

hard heart just waiting to explode on whoever is around them. Being kind and forgiving is the opposite of having a hard heart. We are to be the most forgiving community of forgiven people.

Three practical steps to forgiveness:

- Ask God to forgive us for our unforgiveness.
- Forgive the person who wronged us.
- Pray God's blessings for them.

By doing these, we break the power of the enemy in our lives. Every time we feel unforgiveness creep back up in our heart toward someone, we can repeat these steps and allow God to change our heart toward them and the situation. When we do, we'll experience the joy of being set free to live the life that God has for us.

Luke 23:34 ESV

Then, six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was who had been dead, whom He had raised from the dead. The servant therefore fell down before him, saying, 'Master, have patience with me, and I will pay you all.' Then the master of that servant was moved with compassion, released him, and forgave him the debt. "But that servant went out and found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii; and he laid hands on him and took *him* by the throat, saying, 'Pay me what you owe!' So his fellow servant fell down at his feet and begged him, saying, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you all.' And he would not, but went and threw him into prison till he should pay the debt. Then his master, after he had called him, said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you begged me.

Should you not also have had compassion on your fellow servant, just as I had pity on you?' And his master was angry, and delivered him to the torturers until he should pay all that was due to him. "So My heavenly Father also will do to you if each of you, from his heart, does not forgive his brother his trespasses."
