Message Theme & Prayer Focus

The Power Of Thanksgiving

"Father, thank you for the truth in your word. Thank you for being the same yesterday, today, and forever. Thank you for loving me, redeeming me, and wanting to move in my life. Teach me what it looks like for me to be thankful in each season of my life, when things are good and when I am in seasons of waiting. Father, your goodness is overflowing in my life and for that I am grateful. Amen!"

Key Concepts/Truths

God's will for you is that you're grateful and thankful, not just when things are good, but in all things at all times.

Even when things are not good, our God is.

A lack of thankfulness leads to losing our sense of purpose.

Thanksgiving is a pathway into God's presence and having an attitude of thanksgiving helps to check our pride at the door.

Whenever we compare, we lose. God's gifts for you are different than they are for someone else. Consistently looking at the things that we don't have hinders a heart of thankfulness.

There may be things in your life that aren't going right, but there's always things that you can be thankful for.

Praise is the expression of a thankful heart, they are connected. Thankfulness opens the spiritual realm of blessing.

True joy is not getting what you want, but being thankful for what you have.

Noticing envy in your life gives you an opportunity to change your direction and grow in the area of thankfulness.

In the book of Nehemiah, when Ezra laid the foundation for the rebuilding of the temple, they praised God. The foundation was only 10% of the project but they entered into praise.

Daily Applications

We know that thankfulness doesn't always come easy but it is a vital part of walking with God. Taking the time to realize that even in the areas we can't control and the life events we didn't have planned, God is still good, still moving, and still undefeated.

Are you living a lifestyle of thanking God for the things He has already done and has blessed you with? How can we practically start to cultivate a heart of thankfulness today and this week?

Here is something to put into practice to create the habit of a thankful heart:

- Make a list of 20-50 things that you are thankful for
- Everyday until Thanksgiving, read your list and spend time thanking God.

Our King longs for a relationship with us and having a thankful heart keeps us connected to Him and keeps us focused on where He is moving in our lives.

This Week's Declarations

Thank you for being the same yesterday, today, and forever. Thank you for loving me, redeeming me, and wanting to move in my life. Teach me what it looks like for me to be thankful in each season of my life, when things are good and when I am in seasons of waiting. Father, your goodness is overflowing in my life and for that I am grateful. You are good, and I trust you.

What's Next?

Now it's time to write down anything that the Lord has spoken to you. Praise Him, Thank Him and ask the Holy Spirit to help you walk this out.
