Walking With God

#### **Prayer Focus**

Heavenly Father, I thank You for the Blessed Hope of Christ's return. Help me live each day with purpose and readiness, seeking to align my heart and actions with Your will in anticipation of His coming. No matter the challenges I face, I trust in Your promise of eternal life and embrace the assurance that I am destined for Your presence, not for wrath. In Jesus' name, I pray. Amen.

### **Key Truths**

Every New Testament author discusses the return of Christ, emphasizing its importance in Christian faith. In Luke 4, we learn that we are currently living in the "dispensation of grace," a period where God's grace and forgiveness are abundantly available to us. We should embrace the grace that has been given to us, so we can experience the things that Jesus said He came for–healing for the brokenhearted, sight for the blind, and liberty to those who've been captive.

When Jesus returns, He will first come for the Church. This anticipation prompts us to purify ourselves and ready for what is to come. Understanding this future event helps us live with a sense of urgency and purpose. When someone dies, it is natural to grieve, as death is an enemy. Yet, no matter how dire circumstances may seem, we have something profound to look forward to: the Blessed Hope, the promise of God's return.

The first time Jesus came, it was to deal with sin. When He comes again, it will be to deal with sinners. Though wrath and judgment are certain, believers are not appointed to endure God's wrath. This understanding helps us remain steadfast in our faith, as we anticipate not only Christ's coming for the Church but also His return with the Church.

#### **Practical Application**

We should eagerly receive the healing, sight, and liberty that Christ came to give us while we anticipate the return of the King, remaining patient yet ever prepared. Knowing that day is coming should transform the way we live. Let's keep our hearts filled with hope and readiness as we await His coming.

The goal of the Christian life is to walk with God. We've been given the beautiful gift of a relationship with our Creator and Heavenly Father. It's only in this life that we can uniquely experience God the way He created us to, before we pass away. We don't get another chance to change our minds and live in the fullness of what Christ made available.

Take a moment to pray and ask your Heavenly Father how He wants to engage with you in that relationship today. What He says will be life-giving, eye-opening, and freedom-giving if you'll embrace it.
