Title: From Sin to Blessing (Sacrifice & Redemption pt 4)

This guide is designed to offer a simple tool for those wanting to take the next step with Sunday's message. You can print this guide to study on your own, or use it in a group and experience transformation together.

Message Theme

A Life-Changing Truth

Prayer Focus

"Father God, I thank you that what you say is true, and I accept that truth. Give me eyes to see where I have believed anything else. I want to remain in your truth and experience your reality. Remind my heart of what you say, and always have that be the place where I live from, in Jesus's name. Amen."

Key Truths

Knowing what God says helps us be able to have faith for it. The more we meditate on these things God has said, the deeper our understanding and belief can be for them. The best things God has for us come through the blood of Jesus, so it would benefit us greatly to spend devotion and meditation time on that subject. Concerning Jesus' blood, here are some points to think on:

- God reaches to us through Christ. Many of the world's religions have an appeasement theory toward other deities where offerings and sacrifices must be made for peace, favor, and prosperity. In Christ, God's way is, "You have already been made at peace with me. I was in Christ, restoring the world to Myself, no longer holding your sins against you." It's God who does this toward man, not man doing things toward God. Jesus is the way to God, the truth of God, and the life of God. He changes everything.
- What is only in your head doesn't work. The Bible says, "With the heart you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved." Head knowledge needs to transfer to heart belief, which moves us to speak and act as evidence of what is inside us. What is in our heart changes the way we live.
- We need a Savior. The law wasn't given so that we could get to Heaven by keeping it. It was given so we would see how much we need a Savior because we can't do life right in our own strength. That

Savior is not just a means to an end, or a Savior from bad things, but a Savior *into* everything good that God has for us–His life! Don't let yourself believe in Jesus simply out of fear of Hell and separation. When situations or lies come up that beg us to abandon God's truth we need to hold to and speak His truth, resisting those lies that speak against us. Believe in Jesus because it's His desire to love you, for you to be whole, experiencing the salvation that is granted to you right now as you live and breathe. God is good. He longs to have His goodness be the place we live from, and we do that in Christ.

- Everything begins with blood. From Moses and the sacrificial system to Jesus's sacrifice, it's all been about blood covering-or atoning. Our redemption has always been a blood covenant from God toward man. The only thing that can fully cover what was-and make all things new-is blood. God says in Leviticus, "life is in the blood", and so how else could we receive new life and all God has for us but through the perfect blood of Christ? Christ isn't just covering us-He says He is in us-and He gives us the right to claim it and everything it brings in our lives today.
- The inward man is made new every day. No matter how old we are in life or in faith, there are times we go the wrong way, but what was true the moment we turned to Christ is still true after every single mistake. There is grace, forgiveness, and mercy that is new every day, and it is God that is conforming us into the likeness of His Son. We can trust Him, His grace, and His process to perfect us in His love.

Practical Application

Sometimes, we come across truth that can be hard to believe–whether it seems too good to be true or we are just of a skeptical nature. There are other times when the situations we face are speaking so loudly that they drown out the truth we already know. What we need to do in these times is rest in what is actually true and remind ourselves of it. Our words are powerful. Here's the thing: When we speak God's truth, it doesn't make it true–it's already true! We simply agree and make it true to us. By speaking the truth, our ears, mind, and heart hear it and can believe it. If there is anything you are struggling with today, find something true from God about it and keep saying it! Saying the truth in order to believe it will quickly turn into saying the truth *because* you believe it.

Declarations

- I am a new creation. Old things have passed away. All things are made new!

What's Next?

The blood of Jesus is the foundation of the New Covenant, offering redemption, protection, and every spiritual blessing. Yet, many believers fail to fully apply its power in their daily lives. This guide will help you understand, apply, and live in the reality of the blood covenant so you can walk in victory and blessing.

1. Deepen Your Understanding of the Blood Covenant

Begin by studying key scriptures such as Romans 3:25, Hebrews 12, and Exodus 12, meditating on what they reveal about Jesus' blood. Understand that His sacrifice was the divine payment for sin, securing your redemption. The New Covenant was initiated by God, not man, meaning your salvation is based on His promise, not your performance. Being "blessed" means being sanctified by His blood, set apart for His

purposes. A deep, personal revelation of this truth will strengthen your faith and transform your relationship with God.

2. Apply the Blood Through Faith and Confession

The power of Jesus' blood must be activated through faith and spoken declaration. Regularly confess God's promises over your life, family, and circumstances, using the "hyssop of your tongue" to apply His blood. When faced with challenges, speak against them with the authority of God's Word. Declare, *"By the blood of Jesus, I am redeemed, cleansed, and protected."* When negative thoughts or emotions arise, remember that the Holy Spirit moves where the blood has been applied. Make it a habit to acknowledge the power of Jesus' blood daily, ensuring it remains central in your walk with God.

3. Live in the Blessings of the Covenant

Walk in the confidence that you have been redeemed and blessed by Jesus' blood. Let gratitude shape your perspective and actions. Pray for the peace of Jerusalem, remembering God's covenant with His people. Live in obedience to God's Word, relying on the Holy Spirit's guidance. When the enemy attacks with negative words or circumstances, counter them with the truth of your testimony and the promises of Scripture. By standing firm in your covenant identity, you will experience the fullness of God's blessings and become a witness of His power to the world.

Jesus' blood is more than a theological concept—it is the key to living in victory. As you deepen your understanding, apply it through faith and confession, and walk in its blessings, you will experience the full power of the blood covenant in your life. Stand firm, declare His promises, and live in the freedom and authority that Jesus secured for you.
