Title: Jesus Healed Them All

This guide offers a simple tool for those wanting to take the next step with Sunday's message. You can print it to study on your own or use it in a group to experience transformation together.

Message Theme

Words To Live By

Prayer Focus

Jesus, I trust You with every part of me—body, mind, and spirit. Thank You for carrying what I couldn't. I speak Your name over my situation, knowing You are near. Let Your healing flow, and help me walk in the freedom You've already won. In Jesus Name, amen.

Key Truths

Jesus gave us authority to drive out demons and heal the sick. Throughout His ministry, He healed all who were oppressed—not by God, but by the devil. Yet many still believe that sickness and suffering come from God. Scripture shows us otherwise: every person Jesus healed was under the enemy's oppression. And He declared that we would do even greater works than He did—through faith and the power of His name.

God no longer holds our sins against us; the price has been paid in full. This reveals a new covenant, distinct from how God related to people in the Old Testament. Still, many wrestle with the thought: "I know God can heal me, but does He want to?" But true faith begins with knowing—not just hoping—what God has promised. Without that certainty, it's not faith at all.

Jesus didn't heal to gain attention—He healed because He was moved by compassion. Time and again, Scripture shows that His heart broke for the suffering, and that compassion stirred Him to act.

Sometimes we assume that God heals based on mysterious or selective criteria, as if He arbitrarily decides when or whom to heal. But the truth is, God established spiritual principles from the beginning. He gave mankind authority in Genesis, and He doesn't revoke what He has entrusted. Instead, He operates within the framework of His own Word—faithfully and graciously. God's consistency isn't a limitation; it's a reflection of His integrity. He honors the authority He gave us and invites us to walk in it, especially through the name of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit.

God heals in many ways: sometimes through instant miracles, sometimes through gradual recovery, and sometimes through healing that unfolds in the future. However it comes, healing is part of His nature and promise.

Practical Application

Jesus carried our sicknesses and burdens so we wouldn't have to. If He paid the price, it's no longer ours to carry. Holding on to what He already redeemed isn't our responsibility—it's a misunderstanding of grace. Because of His finished work, we're invited to walk in freedom, not striving, but trusting.

What area of your life are you waiting on God to heal or restore? How might shifting your faith from passive hope to active trust change the atmosphere? Do you believe that invoking the name of Jesus carries the same authority as His physical presence?

Practical Step: This week, speak the name of Jesus over that area—out loud, with confidence. Declare His healing, His timing, and His presence. Don't just wait—partner with Him in faith.

What's Next?

Applying the truth about God's will for healing can transform your life from one of passive hope to active faith. This message makes it clear that we have a part to play in receiving and releasing God's power. Here is a three-step guide to help you put these principles into action every day.

Step 1: Know That God Is Willing to Heal You

The first and most crucial step is to settle in your heart that God is not only **able** but also **willing** to heal you. Jesus was always "moved with compassion" and healed all who came to Him, proving that sickness is from the devil, not God. To apply this, confront any doubt you may have by declaring "I am willing, be healed" over your life, just as Jesus did for the leper. Base your belief not on your feelings or your circumstances, but on the unchangeable fact of God's character as revealed by Jesus.

Step 2: Release Your Faith Through Words and Actions

Healing and deliverance are often "voice-activated." This means you have to speak and act on your faith. The centurion who impressed Jesus didn't ask for a visit; he simply said, "Just speak the word, and my servant will be healed." To apply this, stop speaking the language of your sickness and start speaking the language of your faith. Instead of complaining about your symptoms, declare that by Jesus' stripes, you **are** healed. Use the authority He gave you to command sickness to leave your body in Jesus' name, and lay hands on yourself or others, believing that God's power is being released.

Step 3: Embrace All of God's Healing Methods

God heals in multiple ways—from instantaneous miracles to a process of recovery. To apply this, don't limit God's power to just one method. While it's right to believe for an instantaneous miracle, also be prepared for a process. Continue to pray, use anointing oil, and take communion, but don't give up if the healing isn't immediate. The same power that brings an instant miracle can also sustain you through a healing process. Your job is to stay in faith, consistently using your authority, knowing that Jesus' death on the cross secured your health just as much as it secured your salvation.

By consistently applying these three steps, you can move from simply hoping for healing to living in the reality of God's power every single day.

Scripture References Jesus Healed Them All

Matthew 10:1 (NKJV) And when He had called His twelve disciples to Him, He gave them power over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal all kinds of sickness and all kinds of disease.

Matthew 10:7-8 (NKJV) And as you go, preach, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons. Freely you have received, freely give.

Acts 10:38 (NKJV) ...how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.

John 14:12-13 (NKJV) "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father...

Hebrews 1:3 (NKJV) ...who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person...

2 Timothy 2:15 (NKJV) Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

2 Corinthians 5:19 (NKJV) For God was in Christ, restoring the world to himself, no longer counting men's sins against them but blotting them out.

Matthew 8:1-2 (NKJV) When He had come down from the mountain, great multitudes followed Him. And behold, a leper came and worshiped Him, saying, "Lord, if You are willing, You can make me clean."

James 1:6-8 (NKJV) But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind. For let not that man suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord; he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.

Mark 1:40-44 (NKJV) Now a leper came to Him, imploring Him, kneeling down to Him and saying to Him, "If You are willing, You can make me clean." Then Jesus, moved with compassion, stretched out His hand and touched him, and said to him, "I am willing; be cleansed." And He strictly warned him and sent him away at once, and said to him, "See that you say nothing to anyone; but go your way, show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing those things which Moses commanded, as a testimony to them."

Psalms 145:8-9 (NKJV) The Lord is gracious and full of compassion, Slow to anger and great in mercy. The Lord is good to all, And His tender mercies are over all His works.

Matthew 12:15-16 (NKJV) But when Jesus knew it, He withdrew from there. And great multitudes followed Him, and He healed them all. Yet He warned them not to make Him known...

Luke 18:35-43 (NKJV) Then it happened, as He was coming near Jericho, that a certain blind man sat by the road begging. And hearing a multitude passing by, he asked what it meant. So they told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. And he cried out, saying, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Then those who went before warned him that he should be quiet; but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" So Jesus stood still and commanded him to be brought to Him. And when he had come near, He asked him, saying, "What do you want Me to do for you?" He said, "Lord, that I may receive my sight." Then Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight, and followed Him, glorifying God. And all the people, when they saw *it*, gave praise to God.

Isaiah 30:18 (NKJV) Therefore the Lord will wait, that He may be gracious to you; And therefore He will be exalted, that He may have mercy on you.

Philippians 2:9-10 (NKJV) Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth...

Acts 28:9 (WEYMOUTH) After this all the other sick people in the island came and were cured.

Matthew 8:5-10 (NKJV) Now when Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to Him, pleading with Him, saying, "Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, dreadfully tormented." And Jesus said to him, "I will come and heal him." The centurion answered and said, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof. But only speak a word, and my servant will be healed. For I also am a man under authority, having soldiers

under me. And I say to this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come,' and he comes; and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it."When Jesus heard it, He marveled, and said to those who followed, "Assuredly, I say to you, I have not found such great faith, not even in Israel!

Matthew 8:11-13 (NKJV) And I say to you that many will come from east and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. But the sons of the kingdom will be cast out into outer darkness. There will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. "Then Jesus said to the centurion, "Go your way; and as you have believed, so let it be done for you." And his servant was healed that same hour.

Psalms 103:2-3 (NKJV) ...And forget not all His benefits: Who forgives all your iniquities,
Who heals all your diseases...

Romans 10:8 (NKJV) But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach):

Luke 17:11-19 (NKJV) Now it happened as He went to Jerusalem that He passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee. Then as He entered a certain village, there met Him ten men who were lepers, who stood afar off. And they lifted up *their* voices and said, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" So when He saw *them*, He said to them, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And so it was that as they went, they were cleansed. And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, returned, and with a loud voice glorified God, and fell down on *his* face at His feet, giving Him thanks. And he was a Samaritan. So Jesus answered and said, "Were there not ten cleansed? But where *are* the nine? Were there not any found who returned to give glory to God except this foreigner?" And He said to him, "Arise, go your way. Your faith has made you well."

Matthew 8:16-17 (NKJV) When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying:"He Himself took our infirmities And bore our sicknesses."

Luke 4:40-41 (NKJV) When the sun was setting, all those who had any that were sick with various diseases brought them to Him; and He laid His hands on every one of them and healed them. And demons also came out of many, crying out and saying, "You are the Christ, the Son of God!"And He, rebuking them, did not allow them to speak, for they knew that He was the Christ.

Isaiah 53:4 (KJV) Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.

Isaiah 53:4 (LESSER) But only our diseases did He bear Himself, and our pains He carried.

Isaiah 53:4 (BASIC) But it was our pain He took, and our diseases were put on Him...
